Convention 2019 Update

For those that are attending the 2019 Convention in Denver and are going to conquer the track at High Plains Raceway you should consider the open track day on Friday July 5th.

Going to the track day will help you to know some of the challenges that exist like 1) the 2838 ft. straight 2) the 300+ feet of elevation change with the steepest climb at 10% and 3) the tightest turn 80' radius and 160 degrees off camber.

To register, go to <https://www.highplainsraceway.com/open-lapping-days>. **Registering is a must** if you want to do open lapping!

You must be 18 years of age, helmets are required, three point OEM seatbelts at a minimum, convertibles must have rollover protection and cars must be in good operating condition with no fluid leaks. The cost is \$180.00 for the day or \$140.00 for half day if you register and pay in advance. Be sure to register as soon as possible.

The gates open at 7:00 am and the mandatory driver's meeting is at 7:40 am with a second at 12:40 pm. Half days are either 8:00 am until 12:00 pm or 1:00 pm until 5:00 pm. Concessions stand will be open from 7:00 am until 4:00 pm.

The track is located east of Denver and to get there take I-70 to exit 316 (Byers exit) and if traveling from Denver at the bottom of the ramp turn left or if coming from the East turn right and travel approximately 18 miles to mile marker 120 and you'll see the track on the left.

As Director's for the convention we look forward to seeing you here in Colorado this summer.
